

Ear Surgery

Advice Following Ear Surgery

- A pressure bandage may be applied around the head over the ear if an open surgery is done. Dressing will be remove the next day.
- You may experience some pain or discomfort after the operation. Please take the pain relief medications and/or ear drops as prescribed by the surgeon.
- You may experience some vertigo, nausea or vomiting in the immediate postoperative period. This should subside within 24 hours.
- Your ear might feel numb after the operation. This will slowly improve and should resolve in time.
- Try to sleep on the unoperated ear.
- It is normal to have pressure sensation or feeling of fullness and a variety of crackling or popping noises within your ear.
- The outside of the ear canal is usually covered by a cotton ball and should be replaced
 if it gets soaked with blood. A sponge-like material deep beneath the cotton ball should
 not be removed until the first follow-up appointment with your doctor.
- It is not unusual to experience some earache when you chew and some difficulty opening your mouth fully in the first week after surgery.

Important To Note

- No swimming, diving or air travel. Please check with your doctor for advice.
- Avoid blowing your nose or sneezing forcefully Gently clear one nostril follows by the other or sneeze with your mouth open to minimise the pressure in the ear.
- Keep your ear dry as water in the ear increases the chance of infection. You may insert cotton ball to the outside of the ear canal before shower and replace it with a new cotton ball after shower.
- · Please do not touch or remove anything deeper in the ear other than the cotton ball.
- Do not dig your ears.

When Should I Seek Medical Help?

Should you experience any of the following symptoms:

- Fever or chills.
- Severe dizziness and headache.
- · Weakness of your facial muscle.
- Worsening pain, swelling, redness or warmth sensation.
- · Foul smelling discharge from the ear.
- Continuous leakage of clear fluid from your nose or ear canal.
- Large amount of bleeding.
- Sudden reduced hearing in the operated ear.


