

# Eye Hygiene after Eye Surgery

#### Instructions

This is necessary to remove any bacteria, crusts or discharge from the lids after surgery to your eyes.

Before carrying out the following steps, you should prepare sterile cotton swabs and sterile normal saline solution.

### **Steps**

- ① Check the expiry date on the sterile cotton swab pack and the normal saline ampoule.
- ② Wash your hands with soap and water and dry your hands thoroughly before and after cleaning your eyes.
- ③ Open the sterile cotton swab pack and the normal saline ampoule.
- (4) Pour the normal saline onto the cotton swab pack.
- (5) Squeeze the cotton swab pack to drain off excess saline.
- (6) Cleaning the Lower Eyelid

To clean the lower lid, tilt your head backwards and gently pull your lower eyelid down towards your cheek using one or two fingers.

## Cleaning the Upper Eyelid

To clean the upper lid, look down on the ground and gently lift your upper eyelid with one or two fingers towards the eyebrow.

- (7) Clean your eyelids starting from the inner aspect before progressing to the outer aspect.
- (8) The cotton swab should be passed along the lid margins only once in one smooth motion.
- (9) You may swab your eyelids as many times as necessary until they are clean.
- (10) Use each cotton swab only once.

#### Note


You should clean your eyelids once every morning or as long as the eye presents discharge or crusts.
